Dyslexia



What is it?

Dyslexia is a neurological learning disorder that affects a child's ability to recognize words. Children with dyslexia often struggle with reading; they may inadvertently omit, transpose, or substitute letters within words. These challenges can significantly slow down their reading pace and reduce precision. Dyslexia can also impact writing skills, leading these children to spell words in a way that mirrors how they sound phonetically, rather than how they are correctly spelled.



Inclusive layout

- Font Arial 14 or a sans serif font
- Spacing 1.5 and only recto
- Highlighting action verbs
- Easy to read and understand methodology
- Number the instructions



- Ask the student to rephrase
- Add visuals
- Build lexicons
- Read the instructions with the student
- Use tools such as pen scanner, dysvocal...



- Provide noice cancelling headphones
- Allow more time
- Use different media
- Allow oral evaluation



- Use explicit learning
- Create mindmap
- Make frequent reminder
- Explain the goal of the lesson
- Use multi-censory approach



Facilitating writing

- Ask fewer exercices
- Write on a computer
- Propose gap-filling text
- Use voice dictation tools
- Facilitate the grip of the pen with tools
