

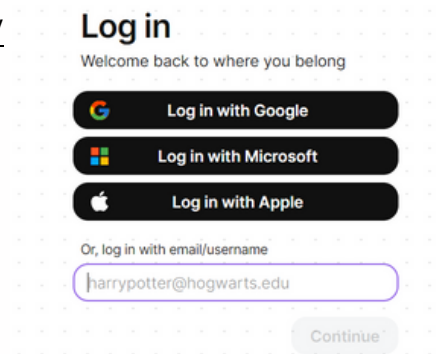


## Padlet

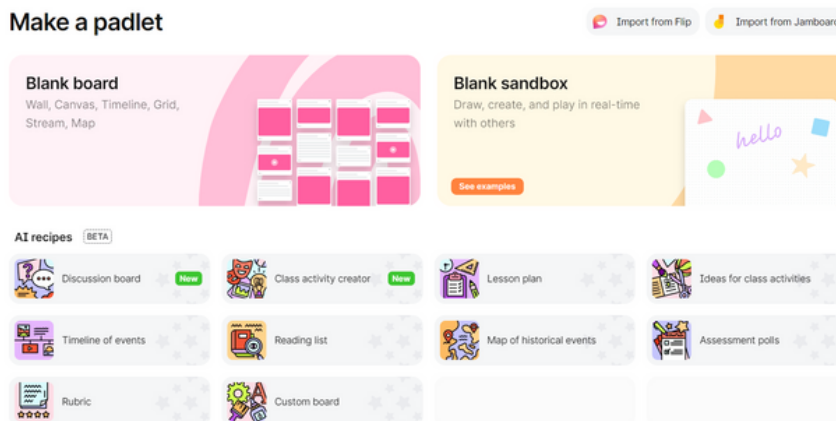
Padlet is a WebApp that creates a virtual wall allowing users to make, share and publish multimedia content.

#### Make a padlet



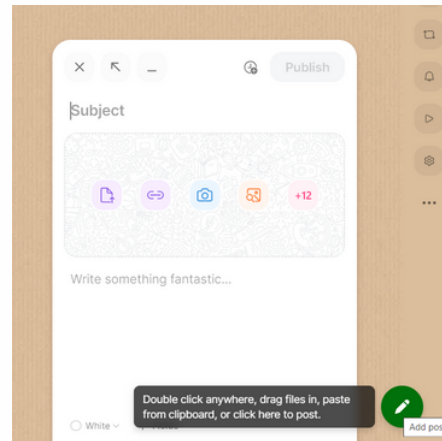
- Choose among different type of boards

- Find a title and set the look of your padlet



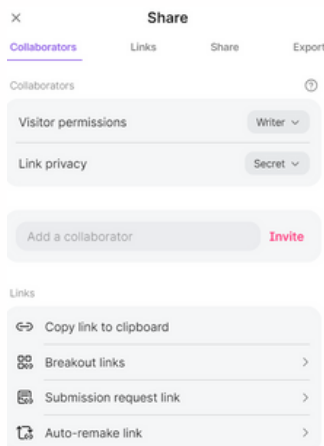

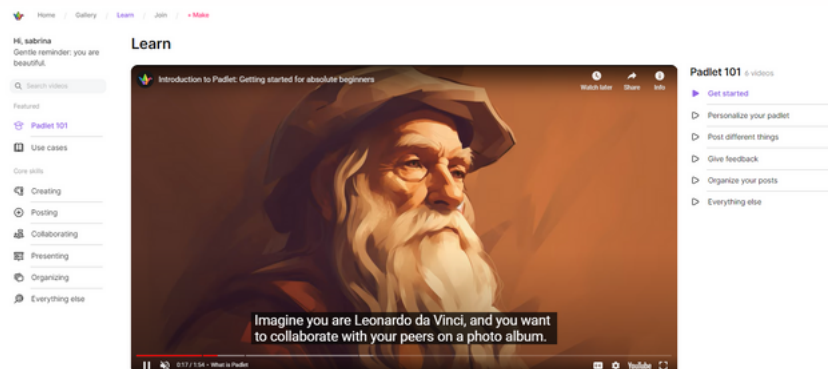
- Add resources to your padlet: Images, documents, videos, etc..

## Padlet

### ● Examples

#### **Arts: The Virtual Art Gallery (Primary and Secondary School, 8-16 years old)**

1) Artist Study: Each student creates a post on a famous artist, including notable works and personal reflections on the artist's style or influence. They can embed videos, images, and links to additional resources, creating an interactive exploration of the artist's life. This activity not only enhances research skills but also deepens understanding of art history.

2) Collaborative Art Critique: After posting their artwork, students can leave comments and constructive critiques on each other's work. This promotes critical thinking and helps students develop the ability to articulate their thoughts on art, reinforcing the value of feedback in the artistic process.

3) Virtual Exhibition with Commentary: Students collaborate to create a themed virtual art exhibition, featuring artworks of famous artists (or their own artworks). Each piece is accompanied by a short commentary explaining its significance or inspiration. This activity builds on the virtual gallery and artist study, encouraging students to think critically about how to present and discuss art in a cohesive, meaningful way.
